Building and Grounds, Airport:

• SPARK GRANT- President Nichols reported the bid process took place October 6, 2025, and the results were 2 Contractors, 2 bids.

GM CONTRACTING- Cedar Springs, \$945,800.00

CARBON SIX CONSTRUCTION- Grand Rapids, \$1,198,000.00.

Both bids exceed the \$789,000.00 budget the Village has available from the CMF Grant.

Tony Mourand from Fishbeck Engineering will take the necessary steps to adjust park features, and present the findings to the Hollister Park Committee.

DDA/ PURE MARKETTE:

Nothing new to report at this time.

WWTP/Water:

- President Nichols announced there have been changes to the federal requirements to receive funding for the 2026 projects. The new scale for funding now includes a principal forgiveness of 23%. At this preliminary point, President Nichols explained the council would need to vote to continue the process, reminding them the Village could still opt out in the coming months if they feel an FDA Loan would be too costly for the Village when the final costs are computed, and the rate study has been completed. A motion to move forward with the 2026 Water Improvement Project as proposed was made by K. Zoellner, and supported by P. Anderson. An all Ayes, 0 Nays and 0 absent vote moved a Roll call vote. President Nichols, Aye., P. Anderson, Aye, C. Miller, Aye, K. Zoellner, Aye and T. Jannereth, Aye. All Ayes, 0 Nays, 0 Absent. Motion carried.

• Trustee C. Miller addressed the council over clear vision areas on Maple and Lake Streets, Fourth and Oak streets along with portions of Beech Street. Summer growth of trees and bushes has caused the vision issues. Clerk to coordinate with LCRC to cut back the brush.

Clerk/Office Mgr:

T. Lamb reported to the council the need for more space in the "records room" and the office next to
the fire station would be perfect to use for older records, minutes books, file cabinets etc. The room
currently contains old computers, printers, and fire dept. related radios and other obsolete electronic
equipment.

She further explained of a recycle company that will pick up the old equipment at no charge to the Village.
